Australian Poverty: Then and Now

Ruth Fincher
Australian Centre
University of Melbourne

Associate Professor Ruth Fincher and Dr John Nieuwenhuysen (Chief Executive, Committee for Economic Development of Australia) are the editors of a book of 18 chapters which examines poverty in Australia today, with a strong reference to how this differs from the situation as revealed in the 1975 Henderson report on poverty. The book will be divided into four parts: a tribute to Professor Ronald Henderson's life and work; the incidence and causes of poverty, 1975 to 1996; poverty and population groups; and looking forward, from Australian experiences of poverty.

The Effects of Immigration on Australian Cities

This project is being prepared as a contribution to the international *Metropolis* project which was initiated by Canada and the United States to examine issues associated with immigrants in the urban context. This overview study outlines recent research findings on this issue within the Australian context. The report will examine the impacts of immigration on Australia's demographic profile; physical infrastructure; human services; and environment, employment and community formation. The study also identifies key policy issues arising from these impacts and highlight gaps in the research to date.

Employment Bridging Courses for NESB Professionals

This study analyses the range and comparative effectiveness of employment bridging courses for migrant professionals, including the types of models most likely to lead to successful outcomes .

The Initial Labour Market Experiences of Immigrants

Lynne Williams, Jill Murphy and Clive Brooks

A major indicator of settlement in Australia is performance in the labour market. Traditionally immigrants from some non-English speaking backgrounds have been less likely to participate in the labour market than those born in Australia or from English-speaking backgrounds, and their unemployment rates have been relatively higher. It is also generally accepted that the hardest time to find a job is on arrival. This study will use data from the first

wave of the Longitudinal Survey of Immigrants to Australia to examine indicators of labour market experience for recently arrived immigrants, to see if these vary according to a range of migration, demographic and socioeconomic characteristics. The results should provide input to consideration of modifications or changes to aspects of settlement policy at both Federal and State/Territory levels.

The Labour Market Experience of Second-generation Australians

The performance in the labour market of the children of immigrants to Australia provides an indication of how well the immigrant population is settling and integrating into the Australian community. If labour market success is determined by knowledge and familiarity with Australian institutions and English language capability, then second-generation Australians should perform as well as those born in Australia to Australia-born parents. However, the labour market success of the second generation may be similar to that of the first generation if factors such as not speaking English at home, or employers discriminating on the basis of appearance, are important. The aim of this study is to analyse the labour market performance, in terms of labour force status, occupation and income, of second-generation Australians in relation to that of those born overseas and those with Australia-born parents.

Longitudinal Survey of Immigrants to Australia (LSIA): Assessment of Needs for ESL Services

The analysis includes a comparison with AMEP data. The result should enable program planners to assess take-up rates on English courses and to

identify demand for community-based courses.

LSIA: Immigrants' State/Territory Locational Choices

This study will enable States and Territories to make an assessment of what attracts immigrants to particular States or Territories, identify the role of any information strategies and compare immigrants' initial point of entry with subsequent locational choices.

LSIA: Interpreter and Translator Availability

Immigrants' utilisation of services, as well as their accessibility to and satisfaction with interpretation and translation services, are examined in this study.

LSIA: Migrant Health and Use of Services

Objectives for this study are to identify differences in health trends in people from different countries; identify health issues including mental health; and examine the utilisation of health services.

LSIA: Overseas Qualifications Assessment

This important area will identify barriers to immigrants seeking qualifications assessment, identify benefits of skills assessment prior to arrival in Australia, examine time taken by different assessment agencies, and measure under-utilisation of skills.

Settlement Needs of Black Africans in Australia

David Cox
La Trobe University

The aim of this study is to undertake detailed research of the socioeconomic-demographic characteristics of black Africans in Australia, addressing each ethnic group and subgroup separately. It also explores the immigration, settlement and integration needs of black Africans, identifying the major difficulties encountered by the various subgroupings together with the coping strategies being utilised. Policy and program initiatives likely to be beneficial in responding to the more problematic aspects of the situation are suggested, bearing in mind the differing situations prevailing in the various ethnic groups and in the different areas of residence.

Two Decades Later: An Evaluation of the Changes Made in the Role of Ethnic Welfare Organisations in the Provision of Social Services for Migrants Following the Galbally Report

Following the Galbally Report in 1978, the Federal Government gave ethnic welfare organisations a key role in the provision of social services to migrants, implementing this change through the Grant In Aid program. Ethnic welfare organisations subsequently underwent rapid development. This study aims to investigate this transformation by looking at thirty-four ethnic welfare organisations in Victoria, including analysis of their funding sources, services, clients, staff and management. This research will contribute strongly to the knowledge base of the ethnic welfare agencies themselves, many of whom are too small to carry out services evaluation or client research themselves. It will also feed into migrant services policy development at federal, state and local government levels.
